



#### ORCID stands for Open Researcher and Contributor iD

- A 16- digit ID unique numerical identification number which connects all research works to the researcher's profile.
- ORCiD has been mandated by several funding agencies.



## Why ORCID?

- · Improved discoverability.
- Customizable visibility for researcher's work.
- Auto population of some grant applications, forms, and Science Experts
  Network Curriculum Vitae (SciENcv).
- · Tracks all research work done both nationally and internationally.
- Links several federal and non-federal databases to simplify application process.



## How is CU Find related to ORCiD?

- · Helps to keep track of researcher's profile and publications.
- Helps with grant application process.
- Establishes working relationships between assigned librarians, OSRP and researchers.



#### How does an ORCID come into action?

Organize funders, publishers, scholarly societies and associations.

Gets Grant Funding from federal, foundation, nonprofit, or state organizations.

Funding sponsors review past work done by the researcher in different organizations.

Output of research obtained from articles or publications done by the researcher under different names or naming conversions.





# How to create an ORCiD?
