Registration

Course descriptions are in the 2020 Campbell University Undergraduate Studies Bulletin. It is the student's responsibility to satisfy all course prerequisites. Campbell University reserves the right to limit class enrollments and to cancel classes with insufficient enrollment. Registration will begin October 26 and continue through the open registration period. Advisors are available Monday – Thursday 8:30 am – 5:30 pm and Friday 8:30 am – 5:00 pm to assist students with the registration process.

Tuition and Lab Fees

Tuition is \$450.00 per credit hour for all undergraduate courses. In addition, there is a Technology Fee of \$30 per 8 week term. A deferred payment plan is available at no extra cost with approval from the Business Office.

There is a reduced tuition rate for active-duty service members, veterans and retired veterans. Please contact our VA representative, Sharon Kissick, for details (kissick@campbell.edu or 919-865-4462).

Financial Aid

All aspects of financial aid are handled at the main campus. Students may be eligible for tuition grants and loans based on submission of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.ed.gov (School Code: 002913). Call 1(800) 334 4111, ext. 1297 for financial aid assistance.

Attendance Policy

Campbell University's attendance policy states students must attend 85% of scheduled classes. This equates to a maximum of 2 class absences per term. The decision of whether a student can complete work for missed classes rests with the instructor.

Add/Drop

Students desiring to drop and receive a full refund of tuition can do so only during the scheduled Add/Drop period by completing an [Add/Drop form](#). Dates and times for Add/Drop are found under the Calendar of Events for Spring 2021.

Withdrawal

Students needing to withdraw from classes *AFTER* the Add/Drop period will need to contact their academic advisor. Students are responsible for tuition costs at the time of withdrawal. Any withdrawal requests after Week 5 of the current term will result in a grade of "F" for that course.

Students who do not attend scheduled classes, and fail to drop the class within the listed Add/Drop period, will be held responsible for tuition costs and receive a failing grade.
