¹ **Campbell Seminar:** Students MUST pass COSU 100 in their first term with Campbell University and it MUST be taken at their home campus.

² **Fine Arts:** "Appreciation," "Introduction," or "Survey" course in art, music, or theatre; "History" courses do not meet this requirement (e.g., "History of Art").

³ **English:** Students are required to take ENGL 100 as prerequisite coursework unless documentation is provided showing one of the following: minimum SAT/ACT score(s), minimum ACCUPLACER placement test score(s), or completion of previous college-level ENGL course(s).

⁴ **Math:** Math elective(s) must be fulfilled with courses numbered MATH 111 (College Algebra) or higher. MATH 110 is recommended only for students who plan to take College Algebra, Trigonometry, and/or Calculus and who do not have placement scores or a previous college-level MATH course.

⁵ **Humanities Elective:** Choose one of the following: CHRS (202, 212, 224, 236, 251, 322 or higher), PHIL 121, ENGL (201, 202, 203, 204, 205, or 206), HIST (100 or above), THEA 115, or Foreign Language (101, 102, 201, 202, 221, 222, 241, or 242).

⁶ **Social Science Elective:** Choose one of the following: CRIM, ECON, GEOG, POLS, PSYC, SOCI, MSCI, or COMM 240.

⁷ **Humanities/Social Science Elective:** Choose two additional courses from the Humanities/Social Science Electives listed above.

⁸ **Information Security Electives:** Take three from the following: ITS 235, ITS 310, ITS 360, ITS 365, ITS 375, ITS 425, ITS 450, ITS 460, ITS 470.

⁹ **Electives:** Any course not specifically required in a degree. See the schedule for available elective courses in all disciplines.

Residency Requirements: Students must complete a minimum of 31 semester hours of Campbell University courses with 12 semester hours in upper level (300-400) courses. This curriculum is for illustrative purposes only. Matriculated students will receive an official degree plan upon completion of their evaluation of transfer credits.

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MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION:

- **Official Evaluation of Transfer Credit:** Students are added to the Official Evaluation Queue after the receipt of all official transcripts of previous education and/or military training and/or college-level testing.
- **Transfer Credit:** Campbell University allows a maximum of 90 credits of transfer coursework to be applied toward an undergraduate degree. This maximum includes coursework from regionally accredited junior, community, or four-year institutions, as well as any combination of military credit, CLEP, AP, IB tests receiving the minimum required score. Campbell University will accept semester hours only for all coursework that received a C-grade or better. The student's grade point average (GPA) will be determined by the work completed only at Campbell University.
- **Residency Requirements:** Students must complete a minimum of 31 semester hours of Campbell University courses with 12 semester hours in upper level (300-400) courses in their major.
- **Graduation Requirements:** All students earning Bachelor degrees must have a minimum of 120 semester hours and all degree requirements met in order to graduate. Students are required to have a minimum GPA of 2.0 in their major AND overall.
- **Honors:** to be eligible to graduate with a distinction of honors, students must complete a minimum of 60 semester hours at Campbell University with a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- **Waived Courses:** In the event a course is waived, the credit hours must be made up in electives.

BACHELOR OF APPLIED SCIENCE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS - Students must meet the criteria of either (A) or (B):

- (A) Student must possess an earned Associate in Applied Science degree in the academic discipline, from a regionally accredited college or regionally accredited technical school. The degree must include a minimum of 10 semester hours in the major area. A maximum of 21 semester hours qualifying applied science credit will be accepted towards the completion of the degree. Students will be permitted to transfer in a limited number of additional credits from other community college-level course work.
- (B) Student must have completed a military service school that has a minimum of 10 semester hours of qualifying applied science credits as recommended by the American Council on Education (ACE), and/or been awarded the Military Occupational Specialty (MOS for Army and Marine Corps, Air Force Specialty Code [AFSC] for Air Force, Naval Enlisted Code [NEC] for Navy) that is comparable to (A) above. A maximum of 21 semester hours of qualifying applied science credit will be accepted towards the completion of the degree.
