¹ **Campbell Seminar:** Students MUST pass COSU 100 in their first term with Campbell University and it MUST be taken at their home campus.

² **English:** Students are required to take ENGL 100 as prerequisite coursework unless documentation is provided showing one of the following: minimum SAT/ACT score(s), minimum ACCUPLACER placement test score(s), or completion of previous college-level ENGL course(s).

³ **Math:** Math elective(s) must be fulfilled with courses numbered MATH 111 (College Algebra) or higher. MATH 110 is recommended only for students who plan to take College Algebra, Trigonometry, and/or Calculus and who do not have placement scores or a previous college-level MATH course.

⁴ **Literature Elective:** The ENGL LIT requirement may be satisfied by completing one of the following literature courses: ENGL 201, 202, 203, 204, 205, or 206. (Or with a 300 level Foreign LANG LIT.)

⁵ **Fine Arts:** “Appreciation,” “Introduction,” or “Survey” course in art, music, or theatre; “History” courses do not meet this requirement (e.g., “History of Art”).

⁶ **Foreign Language:** Students are required to pass a 201 level Foreign Language Course. All nine hours must be in the same language.

⁷ **Electives:** Any course not specifically required in a degree. See the schedule for available elective courses in all disciplines.

⁸ **POLS Electives:** This concentration requires that three of the five areas of political science (listed on the back) be represented in electives.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION:

- **Official Evaluation of Transfer Credit:** Students are added to the Official Evaluation Queue after the receipt of all official transcripts of previous education and/or military training and/or college-level testing.
- **Transfer Credit:** Campbell University allows a maximum of 90 credits of transfer coursework to be applied toward an undergraduate degree. This maximum includes coursework from regionally accredited junior, community, or four-year institutions, as well as any combination of military credit, CLEP, AP, IB tests receiving the minimum required score. Campbell University will accept semester hours only for all coursework that received a C-grade or better. The student's grade point average (GPA) will be determined by the work completed only at Campbell University.
- **Residency Requirements:** Students must complete a minimum of 31 semester hours of Campbell University courses with 12 semester hours in upper level (300-400) courses in their major.
- **Graduation Requirements:** All students earning Bachelor degrees must have a minimum of 120 semester hours and all degree requirements met in order to graduate. Students are required to have a minimum GPA of 2.0 in their major AND overall.
- **Honors:** to be eligible to graduate with a distinction of honors, students must complete a minimum of 60 semester hours at Campbell University with a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- **Waived Courses:** In the event a course is waived, the credit hours must be made up in electives.

ADVISER NOTES:

Residency Requirements: Students must complete a minimum of 31 semester hours of Campbell University courses with 12 semester hours in upper level (300-400) courses. This curriculum is for illustrative purposes only. Matriculated students will receive an official degree plan upon completion of their evaluation of transfer credits.
