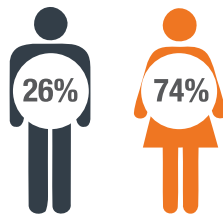

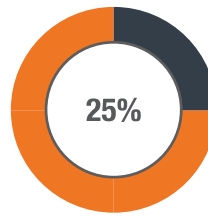

Ranges from 20-41 years of age.



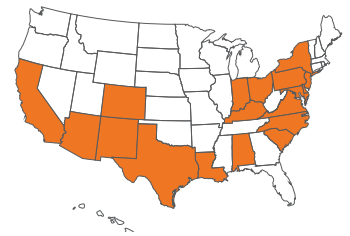
### Gender

## Doctor of Pharmacy

### Prerequisites

- Economics – 3 credit hours (Course must be denoted as an economics course in your university catalog)
- Calculus – 3 credit hours (Example: Calculus I, Analytical Geometry & Calculus)
- Physics with lab – 4 credit hours (Physics for health professions majors - does not need to be calculus based)
- General chemistry with lab – 8 credit hours
- Organic chemistry with lab – 8 credit hours
- Biological sciences – 4 credit hours each of General Biology, Anatomy & Physiology (one course covering the whole body, or a two-course progression), and Microbiology, all with lab
- Public Speaking - 3 credit hours
- Statistics - 3 credit hours

### Application Process

1. Complete a PharmCAS application, including submitting PCAT scores and three letters of recommendation.
2. Complete a supplemental application, including submitting a passport size photo and \$50 application fee.
3. Consider applying [Early Decision](#) through PharmCAS. This allows you to apply for your top choice pharmacy school early, and subsequently get your acceptance determination early. Automatic Dean's Early Decision Scholarship 3.2 and 60th percentile on the PCAT - \$15k for 2 years automatically (pending P1 year GPA of 3.5)

### Scholarships

- Competitive selection process for approximately \$1.5 million awarded in total endowed and annual scholarships
- Dean's Scholarship for accepted students with an overall PharmCAS GPA of 3.5
- Award: \$10,000 for 2 years if a GPA of 3.5 is maintained through P1 year
- Additional Distinguished Dean's Scholarship nominations in awards of up to full tuition for 2 years for eligible candidates
  - Candidates should have leadership and community service with a GPA of 3.2 and score in the 60th percentile on the PCAT; OR
  - Candidates should have leadership and community service with a GPA of 3.5

### Program Highlights
