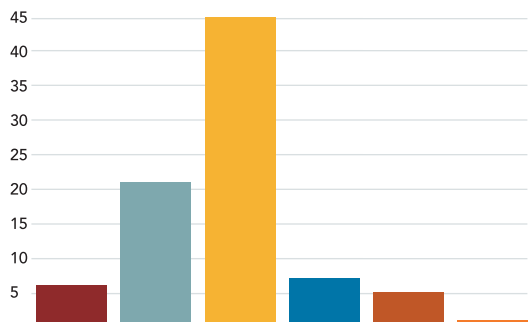

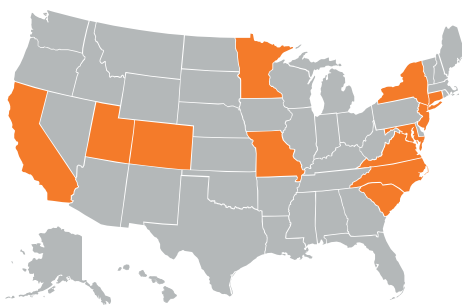

Prerequisites

For applicants with bachelor's degree:

- Calculus – 3 credit hours
- Physics with lab – 4 credit hours
- General chemistry with lab – 8 credit hours
- Organic chemistry with lab – 7-8 credit hours
- General Biology with lab – 4 credit hours
- Anatomy & Physiology (one course covering the whole body, or a two-course progression) – 4 credit hours
- Microbiology with lab – 4 credit hours
- Statistics – 3 credit hours

For applicants without bachelor's degree, all of the previous requirements, plus:

- English Composition – 6 credit hours
- Humanities/Fine Arts or Social/Behavior Sciences – 12 credit hours
- Electives – 8 credit hours (recommended: pharmaceutical sciences, clinical research, advanced biology or chemistry courses)

Minimum 64 credit hours including all prerequisites are required for eligibility for acceptance.

No PCAT required

- Three Letters of Recommendation
- PCAT Scores (not required, but highly recommended for applicants below a 3.0 PharmCAS GPA)
