MBA Dual Degree Admission Criteria

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher education
- Minimum GPA of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale on all undergraduate coursework
- Undergraduate prerequisites in Accounting, Economics, & Statistics
- Application and acceptance into the relevant partner program

How it Works

The time and money saving benefits of the Dual Degree option are realized through the sharing of courses across the curriculum of both programs. MBA Core Curriculum courses are used to satisfy specific PharmD course credit, and PharmD courses are used to satisfy MBA elective credit, resulting in students taking 18 credits hours less than would be required if each degree was pursued separately.

Requirements for PharmD Degree

Curriculum

The Doctor of Pharmacy curriculum is a four-year, 153 credit hour curriculum, encompassing a combination of core courses, elective courses, and on-site experiential rotations.

Courses taken as part of the MBA Core Curriculum may be used to satisfy nine PharmD program elective credit hours, leaving a total of 144 credit hours to be taken in the PharmD program.
