Internship Module Note:		Grades/credit will be awarded as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All internship modules carry 1 credit hour each</li><li>• Grades for three modules will be assigned upon completion of the year-long internship, final evaluation conference with the Site Supervisor and when site-supervisor and intern’s evaluation forms are completed and turned in to the Coordinator.</li><li>• Grades for three additional modules will be awarded upon attendance at all eight seminars and presentation at one.</li><li>• Grades for the final internship module will be awarded when all Electronic Evidences are deemed complete and are assessed at the Proficient Level or above.</li><li>• All module work must be completed and assessed no later than one year from the end of the last term enrolled in a module. If not completed within the year, candidates will be required to register for an additional one-semester hour course at regular tuition cost.</li></ul>

Graduate Credit	<p>Courses may apply toward a graduate degree upon official admission to the graduate program at Campbell University. A student must hold a baccalaureate degree to be eligible for credit in a graduate course.</p> <p>These courses may be used for renewal of teacher licenses. All questions concerning license renewal should be directed to the student's school unit.</p>

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<b>Withdrawal from a Course</b>	<p>Students must officially withdraw from a class to avoid receiving a grade of “F” for the class and being charged for the class. Students who officially drop a class by the fifth day from start of term date (this includes weekends and holidays) will receive a full refund.</p> <p>An official form for withdrawing from a course may be obtained outside the School of Education &amp; Human Sciences Graduate Office (room B-19). The form must be returned to Sterling Tharrington in room B-19, mail to PO Box 369, Buies Creek, NC 27506, or by email to <a href="mailto:stharrington@campbell.edu">stharrington@campbell.edu</a>. It is the responsibility of the student to obtain all necessary signatures.</p> <p>No more than one absence is allowed for each course taken during the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Exceeding these limits may affect your grade.</p>
<b>Attendance Policy</b>	<p>School of Education &amp; Human Sciences Policy expects no more than one (1) absence per course in each semester. Exceeding this limit may affect the student’s grade and enrollment status.</p>
<b>M.S.A. &amp; M.Ed. Comprehensive Exams</b>	<p>M.S.A. and M.Ed. students must take and pass comprehensive exams. The comprehensive exams are administered two times yearly, typically, <b>the first Saturday in November and the first Saturday in March. There is a third comps administered in June for MSA students only.</b> APPLICATIONS to take the comprehensive exams in November are due by October 15th. Applications to take the comprehensive exams in March are due by February 15th. <b>Retakes for students that did not pass the March administration will be the first Saturday in April. Retakes for students that did not pass the November administration will be on first Saturday in December.</b> Applications must be turned into your advisor by the deadline. <b>An official application form can be obtained by emailing Mr. Sterling Tharrington, <a href="mailto:stharrington@campbell.edu">stharrington@campbell.edu</a>.</b></p>
<b>Counseling Programs Comprehensive Exams</b>	<p>Candidates completing a degree program in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and School Counseling must pass the Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) during the semester before their graduation semester. Candidates should consult with their academic advisor early in their program regarding application and other process issues specific to the comprehensive examination. Importantly, candidates taking comprehensive examinations must be prepared to respond to questions based on all courses in their specific programs. <b>Annual dates for the Comprehensive Examinations are administered: the first Friday of November and the first Friday of March.</b></p>
