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# Application Requirements (page 1 of 2)

- ❑ Deadline for the application is **March 1, 2026** for fall 2026 admission.
  - ❑ A completed application form, honor code, graduate bulletin acknowledgement, Nonrefundable \$55.00 application fee
  - ❑ Official Transcripts
    - ❑ Bachelor's Degree with a Cumulative GPA of 3.0
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# Application Requirements (page 2 of 2)

- ❑ Professional Goal Statement
    - ❑ 4 pages max, prompt provided in the application.
  
  - ❑ Professional Recommendations
    - ❑ If the applicant is currently part of an educational program, at least one of the three recommendations must be from a current faculty member.
  
  - ❑ Following Review of Application: An interview with the appropriate program coordinator or designee.
